Jason received his Ph.D. from the University of Leeds, where he established a polarised projection system to evaluate visual perception in 3D environment. Prior to coming to Norway, he was a 100% teaching associate in digital media at the University of Southampton, Dalian Polytechnic University in China, and a 100% lecturer in animation at the University of Malta.

# Brief description of the project proposal (goal/s, activities and outputs)

Project proposal Inspired by an EU funded project that the applicant has been partnered with, cultural planning in urban innovation, this project would like to push the boundary further by utlising augmented reality. Augmented reality games have experienced their popularities and been validated by studies in encouraging people to play and explore within public spaces. This study explores the potentiality of an augmented reality block building game as a platform for participatory public space improvements. The criteria of an ideal public space have been reviewed and defined for the outcome evaluations. The procedure of the participatory urban design will be based on the steps concluded by UN Habitats Block by Block project held in 2015. Local citizens will be invited to design and build preferred improvements through playing the augmented reality game at the physical sites. Another group of local citizens will evaluate the design outcomes based

on the key factors of an ideal public spaces. The expected outcome from this work will suggest the effectiveness of utilizing augmented reality for public places improvements.
